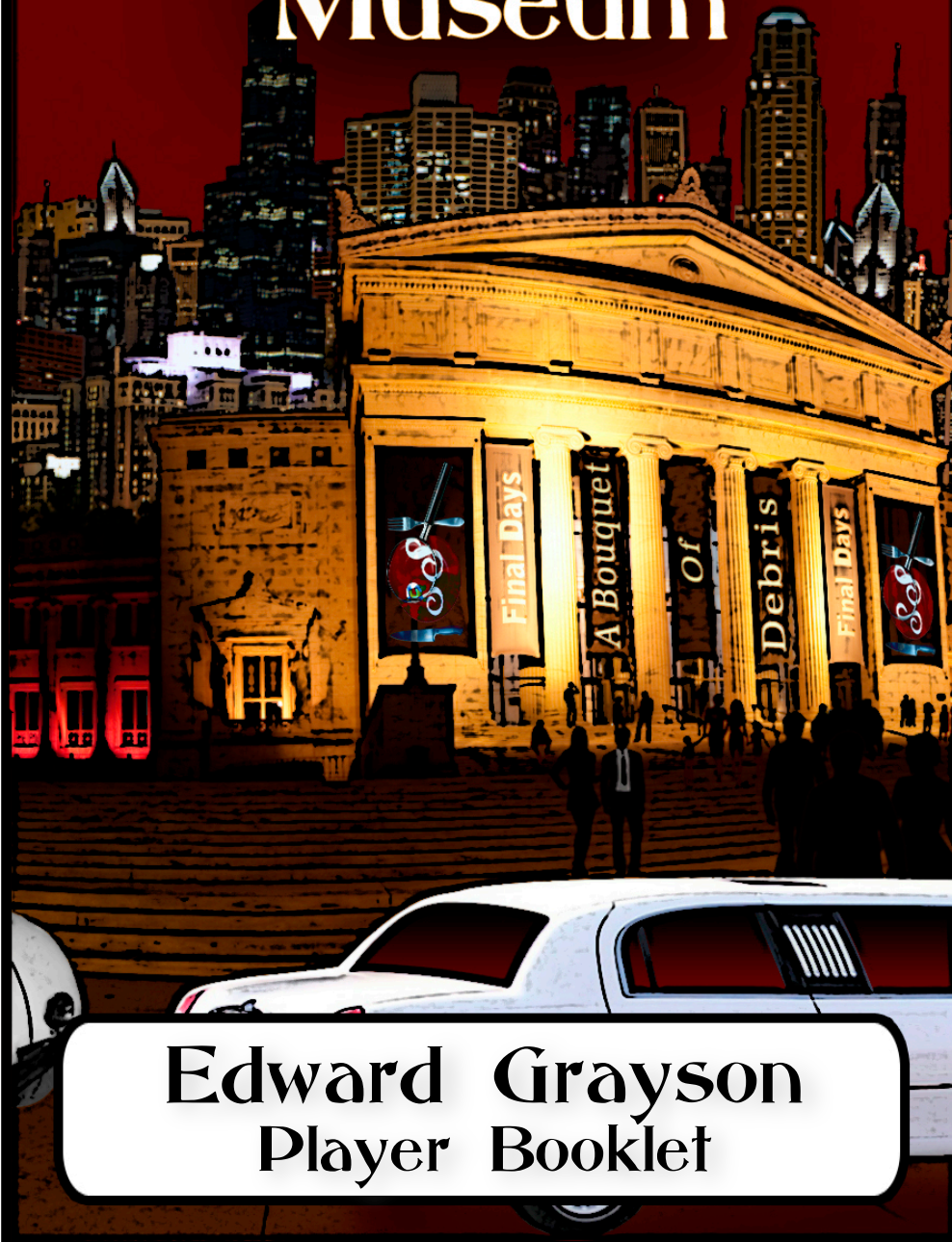

Edward Grayson Player Booklet and Secret Clue

How to Play the Game

This room is full of murder suspects – and you are one of them! You must try to figure out who the murderer is tonight, by both accusing your fellow players and also trying to convince everyone else that you are innocent.

This game has four rounds, each round revealing new pieces of information about each character. Do not turn the page in your player's booklet until the host tells you to do so.

On the top of each page is information you are to share with the whole group. You can either ad lib or read directly from the page, but make sure that before moving on to the next round, you share all information on the top of each page with the whole group.

On the bottom of the page, you will see hidden information about your character. Do not reveal this information right away unless you are directly questioned about it. You may not lie if someone asks you about this information, but you do not need to offer incriminating evidence about yourself without a direct question. If someone asks you a question you do not know the answer to, say, "I am not aware of that information at this time".

There are also 8 secret clues that different players will reveal throughout the night. Make sure you do not look at your clue until your player booklet tells you to take it and pass it around to the group.

At the start of the game, the killer is not aware of his or her identity – it could even be you! Be suspicious of everyone's motives, and remain in character throughout the evening. After dessert, you will be given a chance to make your accusation. You may accuse any player of being the killer, including yourself. However, if you find out that you are the murderer, DON'T TELL! You should say, "I am not aware of that information at this time." The murderer is the only one permitted to lie at any time in this game. Again, DO NOT tell anyone if the booklet says you are the killer! Now, relax, get into character, and have fun!

Share this information with the group after Mark Chase:

Umm...yeah. I'm Edward Grayson and I'm one of the lucky grad students of Raphie, as we all called her. I am just speechless tonight...(blurt out awkwardly) but only in my shock do I find words to talk about this Legend. Raphie was a rare species among women, or men for that matter. Now that I have hindsight, I can see that she was a woman who was destined for a short life - the greats usually are. I am going to do my best to pick up the fragments of what's left of myself, as I was her protégée. No one believed in me like she did. And now, I have been included as a murder suspect for her death. One of the greatest artists the 21st century, or any century for that matter, has just died a premature death and I'm frankly stunned. I could never kill someone of such broad talent. I am quite sure I could never kill anybody for that matter.

You came to this party on the verge of crashing from both lack of sleep and a little too much marijuana to calm your nerves. You want to "lay low" especially because you don't want others to know that you are out of it, even as you try to defend yourself.

Soup/Salad

Share this right after you are accused by Jasmine Lipton:

Hidden Information:

(Do not share until you feel it's necessary.)

You do have a drug problem but you haven't done anything about it other than take more and more. You were very angry when Raphie denied you a chance with her, especially since she gave you, in your mind, a lot of good reasons to think you had a chance. Especially with the friendly advice you gave her about Emma and Mark (more on that soon).

Main Course

Share this information with the group after Jasmine Lipton:

However, I'm going to get busted myself if I don't call out an important piece of information I've got. I did a little grad student research for Raphie on my spare time, whenever she called upon me. She was secretly angry at her supposed best friend Emma for flirting with Mark, her boyfriend. She had me follow them just last night to see if they left her together after they all had dinner. It turns out she was on the right track, as usual. They went for cocktails together, and I saw it all. Raphie said they were lowlifes but I didn't believe her till I saw it with my own eyes. I even talked the maitre'd into giving me a copy of their dinner receipt for a little fix. Here it is. These two had to have plotted her death! Show the group your clue.

Main Course

Hidden Information:
(Do not share until you feel it's necessary.)

You were obsessed with Raphie. You wanted her bad. When you suspected that Mark was cheating on her, you confronted her, hopeful that she would be so grateful that she would give you a chance. Instead, she flirted with you but ultimately put you off and you were mad. You took some LSD along with the marijuana before coming today and you are just now emerging from your high.
