How to Play the Game

This room is full of murder suspects – but don't worry, you are not one of them! You must try to figure out who the murderer is tonight by accusing your fellow players.

This game has four rounds, each round revealing new pieces of information about each character. Do not turn the page in your player's booklet until the host tells you to do so.

On the top of each page is information you are to share with the whole group. You can either ad lib or read directly from the page, but make sure that before moving on to the next round, you share all information on the top of each page with the whole group.

On the bottom of the page, you will see hidden information about your character. Do not reveal this information right away unless you are directly questioned about it. You may not lie if someone asks you about this information, but you do not need to offer incriminating evidence about yourself without a direct question. If someone asks you a question you do not know the answer to, say, "I am not aware of that information at this time".

There are 8 secret clues that different players will reveal throughout the night. Be suspicious of everyone's motives, and remain in character throughout the evening. After dessert, you will be given a chance to make your accusation. You may accuse any player of being the killer, but you should have good evidence! Now, relax, get into character, and have some fun!

Share this information with the group:

(Use a fake British accent if possible) Hiya! I'm Libby Reed, wife of the great head waiter, Rolo Reed. Normally when I come to work with Rolo I just stay in the kitchen and sample a taste of his culinary divinity. When Rolo told me of the murder, I was horrified. There's not a chance I'm staying in there all alone with the big knives and all. I'm a timid one as it is, let alone with a killer on the loose. And that poor Raphaela, Lord love her, seemed friendly enough, though a bit daffy. Who could do such a beastly thing? I think I'll stay out here the whole night, if that's okay by you all. Only rubbish on the telly tonight anyway.
